SUBJECT: Representative Bob McClory

I met with Bob McClory at 5:00 p. m. this date and went over what the Select Committee agreed to in it's afternoon meeting with Otis Pike. McClory dictated his notes. The following points ~~which~~ were agreed to:

1. The Committee will not return the classified material received.
2. In describing the Administration response to the materials subpoenaed on the Tet offensive, the Committee agrees to the omission of the names of agents or informers. The Committee does want to know what information is screened and requests that all sensitive information words or phrases be circled or underlined.
3. Procedures. The Committee agrees that:
 - a. They will not release information to the public without 24 hours notice to the Executive Branch and the opportunity for the Executive to comment or the Committee to receive comments from the Executive. If a person is necessary to testify in this regard and is not available or must be brought in from some distance, the Committee will not release information until that person can be heard or responsible alternative agreed upon.
4. In the event the Chairman feels matters should be declassified he is to give notice to the Committee members that a meeting is being called for the purpose of declassifying information or documents.
